

BOROUGH OF RIVER EDGE STORMWATER ORDINANCES

Below are descriptions of a few of the ordinances that have been adopted by the Borough to help maintain clean waterways:

CHAPTER 122 – ANIMALS

These regulations are designed to keep pet feces or droppings from being washed into the municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4), where it would cause pollution of our waterways.

CHAPTER 272 – LITTERING

These regulations are designed to keep litter from being washed into the municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4), where it would cause pollution of our waterways.

CHAPTER 122 – WILDLIFE

These regulations are designed to keep wildlife from concentrating in small areas and their feces or droppings from causing pollution of our waterways, due to the concentrating of wildlife in small areas of our waterways.

CHAPTER 342 – REGULATION OF DISCHARGES

These regulations are designed to keep non-stormwater flows from discharging into the municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4), where it would cause pollution of our waterways. This includes both residential and non-residential areas. Examples of prohibited materials include domestic sewage, industrial waste, non-contact cooling water, and process water. Examples of acceptable connections to the municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4), include sump pumps and footing/foundation drains. Any acceptable connections to the municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4), must be approved by the Borough Engineer in advance. No connections to the municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4) are permitted unless they are approved by the Borough Engineer in advance.

CHAPTER 358 – LEAF COLLECTION AND GRASS AND FOILAGE RECYCLING

These regulations are designed to keep the Stormwater system clear of vegetation debris.
