## Contest Summary and Details

- Combines student activism, community education and public art
- Collaboration between:
  - EPC
  - DPW
  - Police
  - Watershed Ambassadors
  - Volunteers - RDHS Art Department
- Part of the 5<sup>th</sup> grade curriculum
- Students taught about watersheds, pollution, wildlife, and then participate in the contest
- Each school selects 5 to 6 finalists
- The EPC and Green Team then select one winner per school
- This year's artwork at Roosevelt School, on Continental, and near the teacher parking lot



# River Clean Up May 2023



## Hackensack River Cleanup

- Despite a rainy day, but we had 50 volunteers
- Collected an estimated 2,000 pounds of trash including:
  - Hasbro Cozy Coupe
  - Various plastic bottles
  - Basketballs and Tennis Balls
  - Styrofoam
  - Tarps
  - Traffic Cones
  - Wood
  - But not nearly as many plastic bags
- Worked with the Bergen County Clean Community
- Received a \$200 grant
- September River Sweep cancelled because of inclement weather

# Paddling Day

## July 19, 2023



## Paddling Day Notes:

- Laura Hoogstrate, Patty Almberg and our Riverkeeper representative (Tyler) hosted the first ever paddle day
- Launched 8 canoes from the River Edge Boat Ramp
- Two time slots were offered for participation (10am and noon)
- The 10am trip went North to the Oradell town line
- The noon trip went South to the Von Steuben house.
- It was a reminder of how beautiful the river is and encouraged residents to keep it clean

# Other EPC Events

---

- Sustainable Jersey – Bronze Status (min 150 points, 210 for River Edge)
- ANJEC Membership – Association of New Jersey Environmental Commissions
  - Advocate for strong state and regional environmental policies
  - Provides programming, resources, and advice
- New Jersey Plastic Bag Ban
  - 2023 law prevents grocery stores and retail establishments from providing single-use plastic bags to customers
  - Prevents foam and other polystyrene food containers for takeout items
  - Single-use plastic straws can only be provided upon request
  - Results:
    - An estimated 5.5 billion single use plastic bags were eliminated
    - 37% decrease in single-use plastics
    - Plastic straws reduced from 17 million down to 2 million per month

# 2024 Goals

---

- Continue to reach out to the community and county to enhance environmental options and communications
- Be more active at the Mayor and council meetings providing updates and highlighting events
- Augment our work with other teams including the DPW, Shade Tree, Recreation Commission, Beautification and Historical committees, the school district, and others
- More actively attempt to identify grant opportunities to augment options
- Further connect with the elementary, middle and high schools and provide volunteer opportunities for the community youth
- Be more active in hosting lectures, films, live presentations, and other events for our residents regarding environmental issues and activities

## Prom box return notes:

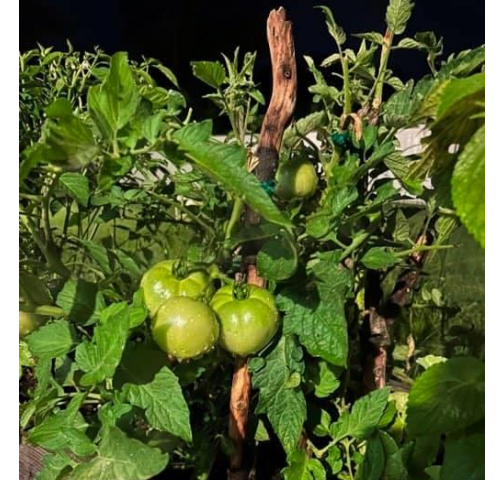
- The team coordinated an effort with River Dell Florist
