Meeting of the Mayor and Council
Thursday, June 25, 2026
7:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER –

This Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of River Edge was held in person at the Council Chambers located at 705 Kinderkamack Road, River Edge, NJ 07661 and virtually via Zoom on Thursday, June 25, 2026. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Thomas Papaleo.

SILENT PRAYER – FLAG SALUTE

Mayor Papaleo called for a moment of silent reflection for the safety and enjoyment of all athletes worldwide in the World Cup soccer tournament as well as the fans and all who are involved. Councilwoman Malellari led those present in the salute to the flag.

STATEMENT –

Mayor Papaleo read the Statement of Compliance into the record as follows:

This meeting complies with the Open Public Meeting Act by notification on January 9, 2026 and January 16, 2026 of the location, date, time, and access information to the Town News and the Record and by posting of same on the municipal bulletin board and Borough website and filing a notice of the same with the Municipal Clerk.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES –

On a motion by Councilman Feffer, seconded by Councilwoman Malellari, and all members present voting in favor, that the Minutes of the Mayor and Council Regular Meeting May 14, 2026, and May 28, 2026, are hereby approved. Councilwoman Dhariwal abstained from the May 14th minutes.

PUBLIC COMMENTS ON ANY ITEM–

On a motion by Councilman Feffer, seconded by Councilwoman Malellari, and all present voting in favor, to open the floor for public comments on any item on the agenda.

Donna Miller – 672 Elm Avenue – inquired about the duration of the PSEG work currently taking place in the Borough.

On a motion by Councilwoman Malellari, seconded by Councilman Feffer, and all present voting in favor, to close the floor for public comments.

Ms. Aportela advised that PSEG is currently working in the Borough with 4 crews to install the high-pressure gas mains and connecting the services. It is expected that the work will take place throughout the summer and then the roads will be milled and paved next year as the trenches need to settle.

Mayor Papaleo confirmed that this has been a multi-year process by PSEG who received grant funding to improve the infrastructure.

Mayor Papaleo noted that the Land Use Board Minutes of May 13, 2026 and Library Board of Trustees' Minutes of June 2, 2026 are on file in the Borough Clerk's Office and available for review.

Mayor Papaleo amended the agenda with the consent of Council to approve the appointment of Ethan Miller as a Junior Firefighter.

On a motion by Councilwoman Malellari, seconded by Councilwoman Dhariwal, and all present voting in favor, approved Resolution **#26-196** - Approve the Appointment of a Junior Firefighter.

Mayor Papaleo issued the oath of office to Ethan Miller as junior firefighter. Fire Company #1 Captain Jim Carroll noted that Ethan's father, Dave Miller, just started in the department recently. Captain Carroll thanked the entire family for being part of the department and highlighted that it is a great thing having all these new members.

NEW BUSINESS –

Bergen County Historical Society Request

The Bergen County Historical Society submitted a request seeking permission to use the Borough's train station parking lot at New Bridge Landing for their Retreat to Victory 250 living history event on Sunday, November 22, 2026. If approved, the Bergen County Historical Society would need to complete a hold harmless agreement to indemnify the Borough and provide a certificate of liability insurance. Mayor Papaleo recommended sending this request to the Traffic and Safety Committee for review and recommendation based on the location of the parking lot and anticipated number of participants for the event. Council concurred with the recommendation.

Proposed Ordinance for limiting Cats/Dogs & Feeding of Stray Cats and Feeding of Birds

The Board of Health is recommending that an ordinance be adopted that would limit the number of cats and/or dogs per household as well as prohibit the feeding of stray cats. This would be an enforcement tool to address complaints that the Health Department has received. If approved, it would be added to Chapter 122 of the Borough Code. The Board of Health has also recommended that an ordinance be created which would add a new article to Chapter 122 to address the feeding of birds. This would prohibit the feeding of birds on public property and create parameters for the feeding of birds on private property.

Mayor Papaleo commented that the feeding of birds has caused hot spots for rat activity. Councilwoman expressed concern about the impact on homeowners who have bird feeders. Mr. Shahdanian explained the legal principle of quiet enjoyment in which one property owner cannot interfere with the quiet enjoyment of their neighbor. He advised that this recommendation would put limitations, such as the 5 pounds of bird feed. He noted that it would be a fair regulation that would allow one to enjoy the colorful birds and detract vermin. Councilman Feffer advised that he was at the Board of Health meeting as the liaison and that the intention of the recommendations is to protect residents from extreme and unusual situations by placing reasonable limits. These proposals would give the officials the authority to protect everyone involved for situations that get out of hand. He reminded the public that cats and dogs be licensed.

Council authorized moving forward with ordinance for introduction at a future meeting.

Determination and Award Certificate

Ms. Aportela reported that on June 16, 2026, notes were sold in the amount of \$14,731,000. The Determination and Award Certificate was provided by the Borough Clerk on Monday to the governing body for informational purposes. These notes were sold at an interest rate of 3.75%, which is the same rate as last year. According to the Chief Financial Officer, we will only need to budget 3.489% for net interest cost which is after the premium is applied. The CFO attempts to

borrow as little as possible to avoid incurring interest. As he has advised in the budget meetings, the amortization schedule drops in 2030, and he will be looking to sell serial bonds which will be permanent rather temporary financing. No action is required on this matter. The only requirement is to confirm that this certificate has been provided to the Mayor and Council in the minutes of the public meeting after the note sale.

OLD BUSINESS –

Mayor Papaleo asked the Borough Administrator if there was a report on construction other than PSEG. Ms. Aportela responded that there are no other active construction projects at this time.

COUNCIL COMMENTS –

Councilwoman Dhariwal thanked the Recreation Director, Joe Ricca and the Assistant to the Recreation Director, Dan Jablonski for bringing International Yoga Day events back to the Borough, which was held this past Saturday. She also recognized REVAS, the Police Department and Fire Department.

Mayor Papaleo confirmed that on June 30th raising of the Pride flag will be held at 6pm in Memorial Park. He hopes Council can attend. He reminded everyone of the 4th of July Parade. Additionally, he commended Michelle Kaufman and Farmers Market Committee for a successful season.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to come before the Mayor and Council, on a motion by Councilwoman Malellari, seconded by Councilwoman Dhariwal, and unanimously carried to adjourn this meeting. The meeting was adjourned at 7:36 p.m.

**FOREPERSON
BUILDING & GROUNDS**
(Department of Public Works)

DEPARTMENT: PUBLIC WORKS

DEFINITION:

Under the general direction of the Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent, the Buildings & Grounds Foreperson takes the lead over a group of workers in performing work involved in the building and grounds maintenance programs, sewer system maintenance programs, for the Department's facilities and/or rest areas including painting, masonry, carpentry, plumbing, electrical, plastering, steam fitting, building construction, grounds keeping/landscape, housekeeping and sewer cleaning/repair, road repair, street sign replacement, parking lot and road stripping, storm drain repair, and tree trimming and removal; does related work as required.

NOTE: The examples of work for this title are for illustrative purposes only. A particular position using this title may not perform all duties listed in this job specification. Conversely, all duties performed on the job may not be listed.

NOTE: The Buildings & Grounds Foreperson assumes the responsibilities and duties of other Department of Public Works' forepersons during such forepersons' absence from work when assigned to do so by the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent.

EXAMPLES OF WORK:

Assists the Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent in inspecting buildings and grounds for needed repairs and upkeep.

Takes the lead in painting of wood, metal, brick, cement walls, floors, and ceilings of the interior and exterior of buildings; staining, varnishing, and refinishing of cabinets, desks, chairs, and other equipment and furnishings, and the painting and repainting of pipes, radiators, tin roofs, and other types of iron work.

**FOREPERSON
TREES & PARKS**

DEPARTMENT: PUBLIC WORKS

DEFINITION:

As a designee under the general direction of the Superintendent, the Trees & Parks Foreperson will work with the River Edge Shade Tree Advisory Committee, various departments, builders and residents in maintaining Chapter 384 of the Borough's General Code, entitled "Trees". The Tree/Parks Foreperson will also be responsible for the supervision of crews performing tree and shrub maintenance, mowing, bed wood chipping, and park cleanliness ; may climb trees when necessary; when assigned to an electric utility unit, supervises and works with crews performing tree and shrub maintenance primarily around electric power lines, to minimize storm and short circuit hazards; does other related duties as required.

NOTE: The examples of work for this title are for illustrative purposes only. A particular position using this title may not perform all duties listed in this job specification. Conversely, all duties performed on the job may not be listed.

NOTE: The Trees & Parks Foreperson assumes the responsibilities and duties of other Department of Public Works' forepersons during such forepersons' absence from work when assigned to do so by the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent.

EXAMPLES OF WORK:

Evaluate all trees in the Borough.

Logs all tree removals, trims, stumps and new plantings accurately into the Borough's GIS system.

Provides a yearly tree replanting and stump grinding list that follows Chapter 384 of the Borough's General Code, entitled "Trees".

Reviews all tree removal permits.

Measures and calculations of all trees to make sure the submitted permit is correct to set accurate fees and bond rates.

Works with residents and businesses on a tree replacement plan.

Responds to all emergency situations required to protect the public, including setting barriers and/or warning devices and performing ice control and snow removal operations.

Supervises and works with crews performing tree and shrub maintenance tasks.

Climbs trees using individual climbing gear such as saddles and rope; may work from a vertical lift truck when conditions are unsafe to climb or remove dead or diseased limbs or top trees.

Uses pole shears, saws, axes and other cutting tools to prune trees or remove dead limbs; operates and feeds branches into chipper.

Cares for trees damaged by storm or disease by trimming, topping, and/or removing damaged or hazardous limbs, following established industry guidelines.

Supervises the work operations and/or functional programs and has responsibility for effectively recommending the hiring, firing, promoting, demoting, and/or disciplining of employees.

Cut down trees using chain or hand saws.

Use ropes and pulleys to remove tree branches.

Bags and transplants trees and shrubs using burlap and shovel.

Ability to supervise and work with crews performing utility line clearance tree trimming operations.

Ability to operate aerial trucks, pole saw, chain saw, chippers, winches, stump grinders or other mechanized equipment as necessary for maintenance of utility properties and rights-of-way.

Ability to use insulated stick or other approved personal protective equipment to remove limbs from power lines or energized equipment.

Ability to fell trees interfering with power service, using chainsaws.

Plants trees and shrubs by digging holes, setting, back-filling, watering and bracing.

Visually inspects trees and shrubs to diagnose disease, infestation, damage or unsafe conditions.

Performs minor maintenance to equipment or tools used.

Ensure safety procedures, rules and regulations are followed.

May operate motor vehicles and light construction equipment on a limited basis.

Ability to operate all equipment used in everyday operations (loader, sweeper, tree truck, sewer truck, backhoe, etc.).
