CALL THE MEETING TO ORDER -

Mayor Moscaritolo called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the Borough Hall.

SILENT PRAYER - FLAG SALUTE

Mayor Moscaritolo called for a moment of silent prayer and asked Council President Cordts to lead the salute to the flag.

MISSION STATEMENT & OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS -

Mayor Moscaritolo read the Mission Statement into the record as follows:

The New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to ensure the right of the public to have advance notice of and attend any meetings of public bodies at which any business effecting their interest is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with this act the Mayor and Council of the Borough of River Edge have caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time and place thereof posted in the Borough Hall and notices have been sent to the Record and the Ridgewood News.

The mission of this governing body is to provide essential services through the establishment and implementation of public policy that will safeguard our infrastructure, provide honest, courteous and professional services; and establish a sense of trust and accomplishment with our residents. Through research and prudent planning we seek to minimize risks while improving our services. We are sensitive to the needs of our taxpayers while realizing that this governing body cannot be all things to all people within the revenue constraints imposed by state mandates, economic conditions and prevailing attitudes about taxation.

#12-408 Enter into a Shared Services Agreement with the River Edge Board of Education for Custodial Safekeeping Services

WHEREAS, the River Edge Board of Education is desirous of contracting for custodial safekeeping services; and

WHEREAS, the River Edge Board of Education is in need of a safe deposit box to securely store vital legal documents and items pertaining to the Board's operations; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of River Edge is willing to permit the Board of Education to keep a safe within its vault for the secure storage of vital documents at no fee; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of River Edge and the River Edge Board of Education are desirous of reducing costs and wish to share the benefits and responsibilities of providing custodial safekeeping services; and

WHEREAS, both participants have established certain policies concerning the operation and have allocated any risk exposure as may usually and ordinarily be incurred in the providing of custodial safekeeping services; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of River Edge have discussed this matter at the work session meeting of November 19, 2012 and are in favor of the Borough's participation in the agreement.

#12-409 Amend Confirmation of Local Assessments for Curbs, Sidewalk and Driveway Aprons for the 2011 Howland Avenue & Kinderkamack Road Intersection Improvement Project (Traffic Light)

WHEREAS, reconstruction of curb, sidewalk and driveway aprons on Howland Avenue for the Intersection Improvement Project (traffic light) were made in 2011; and

WHEREAS, the construction of new curbs, sidewalk and driveway aprons are local improvements, the value of which is assessable to owners of the adjacent property; and

#12-414 Sustainable Land Use Pledge Resolution

WHEREAS, land use is an essential component of overall sustainability for a municipality; and

WHEREAS, poor land-use decisions can result in situations such as decreased mobility, high housing costs, increased greenhouse gas emissions, loss of open space and the degradation of natural resources; and

WHEREAS, well planned land use can create transportation choices, provide for a range of housing options, create walkable communities, preserve open space, provide for adequate recreation, and allow for the continued protection and use of vital natural resources; and

WHEREAS, Given New Jersey's strong tradition of home rule and local authority over planning and zoning, achieving a statewide sustainable land use pattern will require municipalities to take the lead;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough the River Edge that the following steps will be taken with regard to our municipal land-use decisions with the intent of making the Borough of River Edge a truly sustainable community. It is intended that these principles be included in the next master plan revision and reexamination report and incorporated into future land-use zoning, natural resource protection, and other ordinances accordingly:

Regional Cooperation - We pledge to reach out to administrations of our neighboring municipalities concerning land-use decisions, and to take into consideration regional impacts when making land-use decisions.

Transportation Choices - We pledge to create transportation choices with a Complete Streets approach by considering all modes of transportation, including walking, biking, transit and automobiles through, when planning transportation projects and reviewing development applications. We will reevaluate our parking with the goal of limiting the amount of required parking spaces, promoting shared parking and other innovative parking alternatives, and encouraging structured parking alternatives where appropriate.

Natural Resource Protection - We pledge to take action to protect the natural resources of the State for environmental, recreational and agricultural value, avoiding or mitigating negative impacts to these resources. Further, we pledge to complete a Natural Resources Inventory when feasible to identify and assess the extent of our natural resources and to link natural resource management and protection to carrying capacity analysis, land-use and open space planning.

Mix of Land Uses - We pledge to use our zoning power to allow for a mix of residential, retail, commercial, recreational and other land use types in areas that make the most sense for our municipality and the region, particularly in downtown and town center areas.

Housing Options - We pledge, to the extent feasible, through the use of our zoning power to foster a diverse mix of housing types and locations, including single- and multi-family, for-sale and rental options, to meet the needs of all people at a range of income levels.

Green Design - We pledge to incorporate the principles of green design and renewable energy generation into municipal buildings to the extent feasible and when updating our site plan and subdivision requirements for residential and commercial buildings.

Municipal Facilities Siting - We pledge, to the extent feasible, to take into consideration factors such as walkability, bikability, greater access to public transit, proximity to other land-use types, and open space when locating new or relocated municipal facilities.

Mayor Moscaritolo-stated that they perform best when they are under pressure and feels that the entire event came off without a hitch. He thanked Councilman Cappola for keeping the flow going and playing the appropriate music and also thanked the Council members for showing up and participating in the sing-a-long. The Mayor thanked Liz Stewart and the Shade Tree Commission for making sure the holiday tree was planted on time and for the new trees that have been planted throughout town.
