CALL THE MEETING TO ORDER -

Mayor Moscaritolo called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m. in the Court Room of the Public Safety Building.

SILENT PRAYER - FLAG SALUTE

Mayor Moscaritolo called for a moment of silent prayer or reflection and asked Councilman Mignone to lead the salute to the flag.

MISSION STATEMENT & OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS -

Mayor Moscaritolo read the Mission Statement into the record as follows:

The New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to ensure the right of the public to have advance notice of and attend any meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interest is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with this act the Mayor and Council of the Borough of River Edge have caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time and place thereof posted in the Borough Hall and notices have been sent to the Record and the Ridgewood News. The mission of this governing body is to provide essential services through the establishment and implementation of public policy that will safeguard our infrastructure provide honest, courteous and professional services; and establish a sense of trust and accomplishment with our residents. Through research and prudent planning we seek to minimize risks while improving our services. We are sensitive to the needs of our taxpayers while realizing that this governing body cannot be all things to all people within the revenue constraints imposed by state mandates, economic conditions and prevailing attitudes about taxation.

LIAISON REPORTS -

Councilwoman Murphy - Liaison to Shade Tree Commission, Library, Environmental Protection Commission, Green Team, Technology Committee, New Milford and Oradell Shared Services Committee - reported that the Library has replaced and alarmed their emergency doors and are currently getting quotes to repair the automatic door device. She also reported that she attended the river clean up and was pleased to see such a good turnout.

Councilman Cappola - Liaison to Recreation Commission, Senior Citizens co-liaison, Beautification Committee, Special Events Committee, Technology Committee - reported that the Recreation Commission met last week and discussed the policy document as well as the budget for the 2015 Open Space. They also discussed the problems with the tree sap and debris on the tennis courts as well as the upcoming Halloween Parade which will be held on Saturday, October 25th. Councilman Cappola attended the Beautification Committee meeting where they discussed the Christmas tree décor and street light decorations on Kinderkamack Road. They also discussed the possibility of purchasing large pots for the downtown area. He also reported that members of SCORE have been working on their by-laws so they can move forward and have a proper election.

Councilwoman Busteded - Liaison to Senior Citizens, Co-liaison, Historic Commission, Traffic & Safety Committee, Special Events Committee - reported that SCORE will be holding their candidates luncheon on November 3rd at noon and the Historic Commission will be meeting with state representatives to go over the procedure for their grant for archiving. Councilwoman Busteded also reported that the Traffic & Safety Committee met in conjunction with the Green Team last month to go over the results of bikability/walkability survey. She stated that they have received some inquiries regarding volunteering for the Special Events Committee and hopes that they can add to the committee before the end of the year.

Councilman Mignone - Liaison to DPW, Zoning Sub-Committee, Redevelopment, New Milford and Oradell Shared Services Committee - reported that the Zoning Board did not have a meeting this month. He continued to say that the DPW is starting their leaf collection season and have been using the hotbox to repair several pot holes. Councilman Mignone informed everyone that the Fifth Avenue paving and sidewalk project which we received a DOT grant for will start the week of November 3rd. He was happy to see that the Mayor sent a letter out notifying residents about the project.

Councilman Acquafredda - Liaison to Construction Code Official, Property Maintenance, Planning Sub Committee, Technology Committee, River Edge and River Dell Schools. Councilman Acquafredda was absent.

Councilman Papaleo - Liaison to Police Department, Fire/Fire Prevention, River Edge Alliance Against Alcohol & Drugs - reported that he continues to meet with Police Chief Cariddi and the PBA each month. Councilman Papaleo reported that the Fire Department has responded to approximately 225 calls to date and explained the different types of calls that they had. Councilman Papaleo reported that the Fire Department hosted an open house for the Mayor and Council to come and inspect their building and equipment and on September 30th. He reported eight volunteer members attended a seminar in Allendale to learn about handling emergencies regarding hybrid or electric vehicles. He also reported that the Fire Department responded to a roll over motor vehicle accident on Elm Avenue and on October 5th they participated in River Edge Day where they handed out safety literature and performed a vehicle extrication demonstration. Councilman Papaleo attended a memorial service for long time member Charles Napstek on October 12th and informed everyone that currently, members are performing fire prevention lectures in our schools. The Fire Department have a few signs posted around town to try and recruit new volunteers and Councilman Papaleo feels that they should always be recognized for going above and beyond the call of duty. Councilman Papaleo reported that the River Edge Alliance Against Drugs and Alcohol

continues to work with the state in funding DARE and other programs.

Mayor Moscaritolo - River Edge Ambulance Service - reported that the Volunteer Ambulance Service had answered more than 400 calls and traveled hundreds of miles. They perform emergency medical services on the scene and transport people that are in dire need of medical attention to area hospitals. The Mayor also informed everyone that they are currently taking Narcan training to deal with patients that have overdosed on illegal substances. The Mayor informed everyone that they do not charge the public any fee for their valuable volunteer services. ORDINANCE #1813

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 354 "SOIL REMOVAL" OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF RIVER EDGE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of River Edge, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey, that Chapter 354 "Soil Removal" of the Code of the Borough of River Edge be and hereby is amended as follows:

SECTION 1. Add 354-10 "Enforcement" as follows:

- A. The Borough Engineer or the Superintendent of Public Works or a designee shall have the authority to enforce the provisions of Chapter 354.
- B. The Borough Engineer or his designee shall have the authority to require approval of the installation of soil control/drainage measures, structures and or facilities.
- C. The maintenance of all soil control/drainage measures, structures and or facilities shall be the responsibility of the property owner.
- D. The maintenance of all soil control/drainage measures, structures and or facilities shall be in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendation and kept in good working condition.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect immediately after the first publication after final passage as provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$15,000.00 FROM THE GENERAL CAPITAL FUND BALANCE FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF BOROUGH GROUNDS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of River Edge, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION I. The improvements desired in Section 2 of this ordinance are hereby authorized as improvements to be made by the Borough of River Edge, New Jersey for the purpose of the making of said improvements, there are hereby appropriated the sum of \$15,000.00 of which \$15,000.00 is from the General Capital Fund Balance.

SECTION II. The improvements are authorized as follows:

A CAPITAL ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF RIVER EDGE, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION OF CURB AND SIDEWALK REPLACEMENTS IN SAID BOROUGH, AND APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$92,530.00 FROM BERGEN COUNTY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT GRANT PROGRAM FUNDS AND \$10,000.00 FROM THE GENERAL CAPITAL FUND BALANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF RIVER EDGE TO PAY THE COST THEREOF

SECTION 1. The Borough of River Edge shall construct curb and

sidewalk ramps at the intersections of: Tenney and Center, Bogert and Oswego, Zabriskie and Reservoir, Reservoir and Van Saun, Cleveland and Lozier, Lozier and Van Saun (NE,NW), Green and Wayne (S), Park and Christie (S), Spring Valley and Park (S), Gates and Park (S), Bogert and Hillside, Elm and Hillside (S), Demarest and Summit (N,S), Woodland and Bogert (N,S), Coles and Eastbrook and other locations located on file with the Borough Clerk. Such improvements shall include all work and appurtenances necessary and suitable for the use and purpose thereof. Such improvements shall be made in accordance with plans to be prepared thereof by the Borough and herein authorized to be made. Such improvements shall be undertaken and made as a general improvement, no part of the cost of which shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Other expenses, including but not limited to architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law are permitted.

SECTION 2. The Borough shall expend \$102,530.00 for the improvement authorized in Section 1. Hereof. Said sum of \$92,530.00 is a grant from the 2014 Community Development Block Grant Funds, County of Bergen and is appropriated by the Borough by special rider in budgets hereinbefore authorized. Said sum of \$10,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the General Capital Fund Balance.

SECTION 3. Such improvement is hereby determined and declared to be a capital improvement which the Borough may lawfully make pursuant to law.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect at the time and in the manner provided by law.

WHEREAS, according to the latest valuation reports, the local government Public Employees Retirement System (local PERS) and the local Police and Fire Retirement System (local PFRS) are actuarially sound, in large part due to the fact that municipalities and counties have made full employer contributions as required under the law for over a decade, with local PERS currently funded (comparing assets to liabilities) at 73.9% and local PFRS is currently funded at 76.9% according to the experts; and

Motion by Councilwoman Murphy, seconded by Councilman Mignone to

open hearing of the public.

ROLL CALL VOTE: Councilwoman Murphy, Councilman Cappola, Councilwoman Busted, Councilman Mignone and Councilman Papaleo, voted yes; Councilman Acquafredda was absent.

Cindy Bequeaith-745 7th Avenue- thanked Tom Smith for all of the emergency management information that he gave out at the Library a few weeks ago and felt that it was very informative. Mrs. Bequeaith stated that the building on the corner of Main and Kinderkamack, the old Mr. Bob's cleaners, has a large piece of glass missing and is partially boarded up and asked if the owner could be notified and asked to close it up. She feels that not only is it an eyesore but it's opened for mischief and asked if something could be done about it.

Mayor Moscaritolo-stated that he will ask our Code Enforcer to notify the property owner and ask them to secure it.

Bert Schmitt-662 Millbrook Road-stated that with regard to the pine trees behind the tennis court, he attended the Recreation Commission last week and suggested that all involved parties get together for a meeting to determine how best to remedy the situation.

Mayor Moscaritolo-hopes that our Shade Tree Commission who have certified arborists will consult with Mr. Schmitt because if it involves spraying the tree, the Commission would have to approve the substance or chemical to insure there is no damage to the tree. The Mayor feels that it is a good idea to get everyone together in order to come up with a mutual solution to the problem. The Mayor stated that because the Borough has been given notice by tennis players of a potential dangerous situation, the Borough has to do something. If we don't do anything and someone get hurt and sues us, it will cost the taxpayers more money than if we had the trees trimmed, removed, etc.

Sondra Berman-373 Oak Avenue-stated that she's been a member of SCORE for several years and thanked the Mayor and Council for all that they've done for the seniors. Mrs. Berman explained some of the problems that she has encountered with out of town members, Mr. & Mrs. Shindelman, since April, 2014. Mrs. Berman wanted the Mayor and Council to hear her side of the story.

Mayor Moscaritolo-informed Mrs. Berman that the Borough Attorney has been working with Council liaisons and members of SCORE to come up with a set of by-laws that SCORE can use to prohibit unruly guests. Because there isn't a set of rules in place, the Mayor feels that it's important to move as quickly as possible to get a set of by-laws that can be enforced.

Tom Sarlo, Esq.-stated that he received a set of recommendations today from SCORE regarding the by-laws and he will prepare a draft during the week that he will distribute to the liaisons, Councilman Cappola and Councilwoman Busted. They will then present the draft to the members of SCORE for final input. Mr. Sarlo stated that there will be a provision regarding conduct and behavior as well as a provision as to how to exempt someone for being unruly. Mr. Sarlo continued to say that they've been hearing about the problems since July and is happy that Mrs. Berman has come before them with her side of the story.

Jim Conway-831 Fifth Avenue-stated that he and Ann McCarthy are here as representatives of the 9/11 Memorial Garden Committee and explained that they are an independent group formed to help raise money in putting together a memorial garden not to put together 9/11 remembrances. He continued to say that they continue to stay involved with the families which has been their entire focus. He asked if anyone has any other thoughts or suggestions that they could respond to.

Mayor Moscaritolo-stated that he invited them today because after this September 11th, he received letters and e-mails wondering why the Borough didn't have a ceremony. He was also approached by other members of the community who offered to serve on a committee so that every year there could be a small ceremony. The Mayor thought it would be a good idea to invite the members of the 9/11 Memorial Garden Committee to the meeting to see if they were interested in scheduling a yearly ceremony at the garden or if they would accept a member who may want to pitch in to organize a ceremony.

Ann McCarthy-116 Surrey Lane-stated that there are two memorials in town, one outside of the Borough Hall and the Memorial Garden next to the Library. They've always felt that the garden has been a place for the families to go to remember their loved ones. The families have always been very appreciative of the support that the town has provided to help maintain the garden. She suggested that possibly the town hall would be a place where an annual ceremony might be more appropriate where the Mayor

and Council, Fire and Police Departments could participate. Jim Conway-explained that on the five year anniversaries, the families may want to have a more public gathering at the garden in which case they would get involved.

Ann McCarthy-stated that they are very cognizant of how painful it is for the families and doesn't feel it would be a good idea to conduct annual ceremonies at the gardens. Mrs. McCarthy again stated that she feels that an annual ceremony by the 9/11 monument outside of Borough Hall would be more appropriate.

Councilwoman Murphy-stated that for the past few years, she has invited people to come on September 11th for silent reflection at the monument outside of Borough Hall but there were only a few people who showed up. She feels that it would be a good idea to have something at the gardens especially since they have someone interested in volunteering.

Mayor Moscaritolo-stated that he does not want to step on anyone's toes and exclude any particular community organization.

Jim Conway & Ann McCarthy-stated that they are not stepping on anyone's toes and thanked the Mayor and Council for asking for their input on it.

Mayor Moscaritolo-stated that he didn't want to appoint someone to organize a ceremony at Borough Hall and not give the Memorial Garden Committee the opportunity to be a co-organizer or have some involvement.

Joseph Dunsay-151 Concord Drive-stated that he spoke to Councilwoman Murphy last week with regard to his suggestion to install a green wall at Cherry Blossom Park and provided pictures of what it would look like. He thinks it would be a good idea because it's a great way to have greenery on a small footprint as well as providing privacy for the students at Cherry Hill School.

Councilwoman Murphy-stated that Mr. Dunsay is interested in joining the Environmental Commission.

Motion by Councilwoman Murphy, seconded by Councilwoman Busted to appoint Joseph Dunsay, 151 Concord Drive to the Environmental Protection Commission to 12/31/16, effective October 22, 2014.

ROLL CALL VOTE: Councilwoman Murphy, Councilman Cappola, Councilwoman Busted, Councilman Mignone and Councilman Papaleo, voted yes; Councilman Acquafredda was absent.

Motion by Councilwoman Murphy, seconded Councilman Mignone by appoint Flora Decker, 200 Jefferson Avenue to the Environmental Protection Commission to 12/31/16, effective October 22, 2014.

ROLL CALL VOTE: Councilwoman Murphy, Councilman Cappola, Councilwoman Busted, Councilman Mignone and Councilman Papaleo, voted yes; Councilman Acquafredda was absent.

Mayor Moscaritolo-told Mr. Dunsay that he will provide the photographs to the joint committee, which consists of Shade Tree Commission, Beautification Committee and Recreation who are currently planning the next design phase of Cherry Blossom Park. He also explained that we have a consultant that is reviewing and re-doing the plans and invited Mr. Dunsay to participate in those discussions. The Mayor mentioned that while he was at the Farmer's Market, he met a bee keeper who informed him that there is a shortage of bees in New Jersey to pollinate plants. He continued to say that he would be willing to provide Cherry Blossom Park with starter bee hives which could be used for educational purposes as well as provide honey. The Mayor recommended that if they go forward with this idea, he thinks it should be located at the far end of the park inside the enclosed fencing where the tree farm is so it would be protected.

Cindy Bequeaith-745 7th Avenue-stated that although helping to repopulate the bee population would be a great thing to do, she doesn't think it's a good idea because there are children around who might get stung.

Virginia Korteweg-800 Summit Avenue-agrees with Mrs. Bequeaith's comment because if there is a problem, you have to have someone collect the bees immediately which could become very chaotic. Mrs. Korteweg stated that the Waldorf Astoria in New York City, have their own bee hives that are placed up on the roof. Mrs. Korteweg spoke about her dream to lace together two existing museums and her home within an existing four mile area. She explained that the historical Steuben House is a privilege to have in River Edge but not well attended and at the northern end is the Blauvelt Art Museum. Currently, Jim Bellis owns the Blauvelt Art Museum and wishes to donate this building to the public contingent on making a

museum row of Bergen County. Virginia continued to say that what we have in the middle, is her home which built in 1903 to 1907 and is very different from the Steuben House and Blauvelt Museum. Mrs. Korteweg explained the history of her home and grounds.

Mayor Moscaritolo-asked how we can help her?

Virginia Korteweg-stated that she would like to preserve the mansion for the public and somehow encapsulate it into Museum Row of Bergen County using the Steuben House to the left and the Blauvelt Art Museum to the right.

Mayor Moscaritolo-stated that he thinks it would be a great idea and tourist destination.

Virginia Korteweg-explained that people could park at the south end of town in the NJ Transit lot, purchase their tickets on line and be transported by bus, on a hop on, hop off basis to all three museums. They would charge a nominal fee and include lunch and be open one day of the weekend. Virginia was told that her home must be designated historic in order for this to unfold and is willing to gift all of the interior items. She stated that the Mayor and Council are the only people that can give the go ahead for this concept for open spaces. She has spoken with people from the County about her idea.

Mayor Moscaritolo-again stated that he thinks it's a wonderful concept and suggested that she submit an application to Bergen County Open Space so that they can see if they would be willing to fund this with a grant. He continued to say that if she needed a resolution supporting this, the Mayor and Council would certainly be willing to do that.

CLOSE HEARING OF THE PUBLIC -

Motion by Councilwoman Murphy, seconded by Councilman Mignone to close hearing of the public.
